Canada Summer Job Placement – International Experience Canada Intern

UNB has been awarded status as a Recognized Organization under the International Experience Canada (CIC) program (<http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/residents/iec/index.asp>) and has been mandated to help Canadian youth between the age of 18 and 30 gain an international experience and promote New Brunswick as a destination for international Youth.

The IEC Intern will work with members of UNB's Global Learning and Engagement Team and collaborate with Fredericton's international community to promote the importance of intercultural learning and engagement as a tool for future employment. A series of information sessions will be created to provide information on how NB youth (of any economic status and ethnic background) can secure temporary /summer work abroad with international work permits. A specific focus will be placed on NB's existing bi-lateral agreement with France.

The UNB strategic plan specifically addresses the need for increased internationalization on campus and throughout the local community. Specific tasks include: 1) promote opportunities for all NB youth to gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of cultural diversity in the community and the workforce; 2) implement activities designed to increase awareness of issues and challenges faced by newcomers to NB and visible minorities and 3) promote experiential learning and international internship opportunities which will build skills, knowledge and experience required to enter Canada's global workforce.

Eligibility:

This position is funded by the Canada Summer Jobs programme.

We are seeking a post-secondary student with a focus on international development, cultural studies, cultural diversity, intercultural learning, and / or youth development. The applicants must:

- Be registered as a full-time student in a secondary, post-secondary, vocational or technical program during the preceding academic year and intending to return to school on a full-time basis during the next academic year.
- Between 15 and 30 years of age, inclusively.
- Not attending full-time classes
- A Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (please note: international students are NOT eligible).
- Legally entitled to work in Canada according to the relevant provincial/territorial legislation and regulations (see above).
- Does not have another full time (30 hours or more per week) summer job.

The position will begin June 20th for a 10 week period ending August 27, 2016.

The position pays \$10.65 / hour for 36.25 hours/week.
