MBA/LLB Program

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

If Law is your area of interest, UNB offers a joint MBA/LLB Program. This degree is extremely useful in today's dynamic business world where laws and regulations are constantly changing and affecting the way business is conducted. That's why organizations and companies require people who have a firm grasp of both business administration and law.

In four years, you will earn your Master of Business Administration and a Bachelor of Law. While this joint degree is open to students who may not have a business degree, if you have previously completed a BBA, you may be given advanced standing towards meeting the MBA requirements.

RELEVANCE

Corporations and law firms across the country quickly recruit our MBA/LLB graduates. You will have acquired the necessary skills and knowledge to work in a challenging and exciting environment of a legal practice or corporation. You will learn about the theoretical and practical aspects of the legal system, as well as become familiar with the major functional areas of business. At UNB, it's never business as usual.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

For each year in the program you will be registered in either the LLB or MBA program. Usually the third or fourth year is designated for MBA studies. You will be subject to the regulations governing the degree program in which you are registered, including the requirement that you spend a minimum of two years at the law school and one year in the MBA program. You can count LLB electives toward the MBA portion of your degree; however, only the credit will transfer, not the assigned grade.

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

Although this is a joint program, you must be admitted into each faculty separately with the same admission requirements as if you were registering for only one degree. Normally an undergraduate degree is required for entry into the MBA program; however, completion of the first year of the LLB program combined with three years of post secondary study may be deemed equivalent to an undergraduate degree.

Over the four years spent in this program, you will complete a minimum of 120 credit hours as follows:

Year 1

- First year of either the MBA program or the Law program (30 credit hours)

Year 2

- First year of the other program (30 credit hours)

Year 3 & 4

- Two required MBA courses (6 credit hours)
- Seven upper level compulsory law courses (21 credit hours)
- Three elective Law courses from each of 3 compulsory areas (9 credit hours)
- 24 credit hours of law electives
- For the MBA component of the joint degree program, you must complete 18 credit hours of elective courses in addition to those listed above.

The 24 credit hours of elective courses will consist of the following:
