To continue this education program and ongoing learning, the FDCHC was awarded a 2021-22 Impact Grant from the FCF.

Dr. Rickards accepted the award at a ceremony hosted by the Honourable Brenda L. Murphy, Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick.
