Faculty of Nursing Welcomes Dr. Leigh Chapman

Chief Nursing Officer of Canada, **Dr. Leigh Chapman** visited the Faculty of Nursing (FON) Moncton site on June 1st as a part of a cross-country tour to meet with key stakeholders to understand the needs and interests of nurse leaders, educators, and clinicians across a range of settings.

Dr. Chapman was announced as the new Chief Nursing Officer of Canada on August 23, 2022. Her role will provide strategic advice from a nursing perspective to Health Canada on priority policy and program areas, including health workforce planning and stability, long-term care, home care, palliative care, mental health, alcohol and drug use, models of care, scope of practice and competencies.

Scholarly Impact

UNB students have opportunities to engage in meaningful experience and learning opportunities that have significant influence on the community. These experiences have been enhanced via faculty and staff grant writing and subsequent funding secured via **CEWIL Canada iHub and the Government of New Brunswick Department of Health Nursing Resource Strategy.**

Experiential Learning = Innovation

Practical and innovative health solutions like the harm reduction needle drop box being developed by nursing students. To reduce the incidence of needle stick injuries and related infections associated with undisposed sharps, using **CEWIL Canada iHub** funding the UNB Faculty of Nursing Fredericton students repurposed a mailbox to



create a drop-site for used needles outside of the FDCHC.

Experiential Education Rural Nursing

Through experiential learning activities sponsored by the NBCC and UNB Faculty of Nursing, high school students in rural New Brunswick are learning about the roles of Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses as well as educational and employment opportunities in these fields. Thirty students from the Harvey and McAdam area came to the UNB campus in Fredericton to take part in lectures and

lab activities. The Government of New Brunswick Department of Health Nursing Resource Strategy has funded this opportunity, which will enable such outreach events to be provided for two years.

Research Impact

Faculty are disseminating their work via a range of forums to ensure their research has impact and reaches the individuals who need it most.

Study on Women with Suicidal Thoughts

In a recent **public forum** sponsored by the Canadian Mental Health Association, **Dr. Petrea Taylor**, presented her research findings on suicidality among women. This led to a CBC radio interview about her study on women with suicidal thoughts. Her research focuses on mental health, particularly as it relates to violence and suicide. To better serve people, she hopes the research will be expanded to include more demographics, cultures, and backgrounds.



Research on Barriers to Early Mammography Screening for Refugee Women



Dr. David Busolo's research focused on Refugee women who experience barriers to early mammography screening was featured on a <u>CBC news article</u>. His team aims to examine current initiatives to promote breast cancer screening and barriers that affect Arabicspeaking refugee women.

Research Funding

A national research group based out of the University of British Columbia Faculty of Medicine, the Contraception and Abortion Research Team (CART), received \$3.8 million in funding to address barriers to abortion access and information. For her role on the CART team, **Dr. Martha Paynter** received \$164,000 to improve abortion doula support and materials for abortion care providers to improve care for people who experience criminalization.



Dr. Martha Paynter, received a \$7,000 grant from the UNB University Research Fund for her work focused on the sexual and reproductive health of populations such as trans people and non-binary people.

Lead researchers Dr. Fiona Kouyoumdjian (McMaster University Department of Medicine) and **Dr. Martha Paynter**, and their team, were awarded a \$74,988 CIHR grant to examine health status among children who experience parental incarceration.



Dr. Pam Durepos was awarded a \$45,000 Research Professionals Initiative grant from the New Brunswick Innovation Foundation to fund a research manager to support her program of study on caregiving, supportive care, and palliative care.

As part of the Provincial Initiatives Fund of the Healthy Seniors Pilot Project, **Dr. Pam Durepos** was awarded \$421,603 for the Scalling-Up the SPA-LTC Palliative Program in LTC Homes in New Brunswick study.

Dr. David Busolo received \$292,686.00 from the Canadian Cancer Health Equity Grant program awarded for a three-year study on Improving Mammography for Syrian Refugee Women in New Brunswick.
