A VISIT FROM MANIPAL, INDIA



In August, UNB President and Vice-Chancellor, Dr. Paul Mazerolle and Dr. Lorna Butler were joined by representatives from the provincial and municipal governments, Horizon Health Network, Shannex and the Nurses Association of New Brunswick to welcome nursing students and faculty from the Manipal Academy of Higher Education (MAHE) to Fredericton. The visit was part of the UNB-MAHE dual

degree in nursing program.

As part of UNB's ongoing partnership with the provincial government to fill staffing gaps in the health-care system, UNB created a dual degree in nursing with MAHE, which aims to bring 100 National Council Licensure Examination-Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) licensed nurses to New Brunswick from India between 2025 and 2029



VISIONS OF NURSING: INSIGHTS, INNOVATIONS AND IMPACT

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Denise Bryant-Lukosius, RN, CON(C), BScN, MScN, PhD is Professor in the School of Nursing at McMaster University, where she holds several leadership roles including:

- The Alba DiCenso Chair in Advanced Practice Nursing (APN),
- Co-Director of the Canadian Centre for APN Research (CCAPNR), and
- Deputy Director of the WHO Collaborating Centre in Primary Care Nursing and Nursing Health Human Resources.

She is also an Associate Member of the Department of Oncology; Scientist in the Escarpment Cancer Research Institute and Clinician Scientist and Director of the Canadian Centre of Excellence in Oncology APN at the Juravinski Hospital and Cancer Centre.

Her program of APN-related research focuses on role optimization and the design and evaluation of innovative models of care. She has conducted research about Clinical Nurse Specialists and Nurse Practitioners in varied settings, led the development of APN curricula, and designed frameworks and knowledge translation tools for the introduction and evaluation of APN roles.



KEYNOTE PRESENTATION ABSTRACT

Now more than ever, Canada needs master's and doctorly-prepared nurse leaders working at advanced levels in clinical practice, education, management, and research to design and evaluate health care innovations, strengthen the nursing workforce, and to deliver more accessible and effective evidence-informed health services.

This presentation provided insights on strategies graduate nursing students, graduates, and advanced practice nurses can use to guide successful career development and the implementation of their current and future roles. Ways to fully integrate research, quality improvement, and program evaluation activities into advanced nursing roles will also be explored.



Associate Professor Dr. Jason Hickey recently had the opportunity to visit several Indigenous healing centres and primary care clinics across Canada. This work is part of a collaboration with Under One Sky Friendship Centre to expand nursing and wellness services offered through their Sakələməlsowakən Family Success Program (SFSP).

The SFSP program is led by recent UNB Master of Nursing graduate and alumni Erika Powell and the current expansion project is being funded by the National Association of Friendship Centres.

'NOTHING ABOUT US WITHOUT US':

CO-PRODUCTION OF KNOWLEDGE IN THE CONTEXT OF COGNITIVE IMPAIRMENT

Patricia Morris provided insights regarding selfdetermination in dementia care as part of JBI's World Evidence-Based Healthcare Day celebrations.

"When reflecting on JBI's prompt to consider citizen voice and advocacy groups (the question of whose voice matters), we are also called to contemplate how contributions from people living with dementia (especially advanced dementia) might be counted and recognized.

According to the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) definition of authorship, which has been adopted by JBI Evidence Synthesis, people living with dementia would be required to:

- Make substantial contributions to the conception, design, data collection, or analysis;
- Play a role in drafting or critically revising the article;
- Provide final approval of the version to the published;
- Agree to be accountable for all aspects of the work."
