INTERNSHIPS

Key components of the program are two mentored, full-term leadership focused internships. The first is domestic and focuses on leadership in the work environment. The second is international and is designed as a cross-cultural learning experience.

ACCELERATE YOUR DEGREE

Renaissance College students put their learning into action through a Canadian internship – after the first year – and an international internship – after the second year. Students can also choose a traditional four-year route.
