

1.0 Purpose

- 1.1 Professor Emeriti is an honorary rank awarded, upon or after retirement from active academic duties, to such professors as have served the university with great distinction.

2.0 Applicability

- 2.1 University-wide

3.0 Definitions

- 3.1 Distinguished service shall consist of teaching performance recognized by colleagues and students to be of exceptional merit, extensive research and publication of unusually high quality, contribution to the administration and development of the university of a creative kind, or a combination of some or all of these. The rank shall carry no duties or obligations, but its holder may be called upon for advice or counsel.

4.0 Implementation

- 4.1 Appointments to the honorary rank of Professor Emeriti shall be made by the Board of Governors on the recommendation of the President. The University Senate may make recommendations for appointment to this rank; such recommendations shall be made to the President for transmission to the Board.
- 4.2 Initial recommendations for appointments to this rank may be made by any member of the university to the Honorary Degrees Committee of the Senate. This committee, if it accepts a recommendation so made to it, shall transmit the recommendation to the Senate; the secretary of the Senate, if the Senate approves the recommendation, shall transmit it to the President.
- 4.3 The honorary rank of Professor Emeritus shall be formally conferred at a convocation of the university.
