

UNIVERSITY OF NEW BRUNSWICK: INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ENTERING CANADA

This document is designed as a template for all international students entering Canada to study at UNB during the Fall term. This will help you to identify and gather the required information to present to the Canadian Border Services Officer upon entry to Canada. **UNB does not require this information - this for personal use only.**

Canadian Border Services Agency Officers will want to know the following:

- you are exempt from the travel restrictions,
- you are eligible to study in Canada,
- you have made plans for arrival and self-isolation
- you can self-monitor and seek medical attention as required.

TRAVEL PLANS: Some students may not be traveling directly to New Brunswick. If you are stopping anywhere, you must have a self-isolation plan for this destination as well as for your NB residence

Self-monitoring and Medical Assistance of COVID-19 symptoms
