



We recognize and respectfully acknowledge that all UNB course interactions take place on unsundered and unceded traditional territory of Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet). This territory is covered by the Treaties of Peace and Friendship which the Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet), Mi'kmaq, and Passamaquoddy peoples first signed with the British Crown in 1725. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but in fact recognized Wolastoqey (Maliseet), Mi'kmaq, and Passamaquoddy title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations

ADMISSIONS INFORMATION SHEET

Eligibility:

Canadian applicants who have graduated from high school (level 2) or have successfully completed the Bridging Year Program at UNB are eligible to apply to the Wabanaki B.Ed. program. Students who have partially or fully completed an undergraduate degree are also welcome to apply; student transcripts are individually assessed for transfer credit. Only candidates with good academic standing will be considered. Candidates on academic probation or candidates having been asked to withdraw from university are not eligible. Due to the cohort organization of this program, admission is competitive and the number of spaces in the program is limited. Priority will be given to applicants of Indigenous ancestry and applicants with education-related experience.

Required Documentation Checklist:

- UNB application with \$65 admission fee
- Applicant profile and personal interest form
- Character reference form (please detach and give to your referee)
- Education reference form (please detach and give to your referee)
- Official transcripts in sealed envelopes or sent directly to MWC

Interview:

Once all documentation is received, prospective students will be contacted to schedule an interview. Expenses incurred for travel to the interview will be the responsibility of the applicant.

Documents:

Documents are kept on file for one year, then destroyed. Documents are the property of UNB and cannot be returned to applicants or forwarded outside UNB.

Deadline for Applicants:

All required documents must be sent to the Mi'kmaq-Wolastoqey Centre on or before **March 31st**.
