

The Canadian Primary Care Research Network (CPCRN)

What is the CPCRN?

- The CPCRN is an established interdisciplinary, intersectoral network of people who collaborate on generating solution-focused innovations in primary health care (PHC) delivery.

What are we doing?

Over the five-year period (2022-2027), the CPCRN will:

- Implement and grow practice-based research learning networks (PBRLNs) in every province and across the territories.
- Support the development of a pan-Canadian primary health care (PHC) information system that integrates electronic medical records (EMRs) with patient-reported experience measures (PREMs) and patient-reported outcome measures (PROMs) data, linkable to administrative data.
- Support at least 15 cross-jurisdictional research projects that scale and spread evidenced-informed primary care innovations across Canada.
- Provide capacity building opportunities for trainees, patients, decision-makers, researchers, and clinicians, particularly in Indigenous health; equity, diversity and inclusion (EDI); and learning health systems in primary care.
- Inform decision-making about health-related outcomes through the production of practice guidelines, health professional educational material, and other knowledge products.
- The Centre for Research in Integrated Care (CRIC) will oversee the implementation of this mission within New Brunswick and collaborate on CPCRN projects across provinces.

How will this help?

- Over the next five-year funding period (20 million from 2022-2027), the CPCRN's activities aim to improve patient and provider experiences in receiving and delivering care, population health, and healthcare expenditures in Canada.
