- Review Examples links in syllabus
- Shoot yourself/yourselves talking into a camera (see equipment booking information below)
- Create script/storyboard
- Workshop your script/storyboard at the IT Lab session for your course and get professor's script/storyboard approval
- Book recording equipment: CETL Equipment Pool, Marshall d'Avray Hall room 133 – Phone 458-7662 <http://www.unb.ca/fredericton/cetl/pool/index.html>
 - Video camera
 - SD card (\$10 from Equipment Pool for 4GB card, or supply your own)
 - Tripod
 - Microphone(s) (need at least 1 in addition to the camera's built-in one; a free standing "shotgun" mic and/or lapel mic)
 - Microphone stand (if "shotgun" mic is used)
- Pick up recording equipment*: Marshall d'Avray Hall room 133
- Shoot video
- Return recording equipment
- Edit video: book ahead, bring SD card with raw footage. CETL Media Lab, Marshall d'Avray Hall room 234, Phone 458-7660 <http://www.unb.ca/fredericton/cetl/multimedia/index.html>
- Workshop the video at the IT Lab session for your course
- Conduct additional video shoot/re-shoot if necessary
- Conduct final edit
- Upload edited video (.avi, .mp4, or .mov format) to <http://www.unb.ca/video/>. Log in with your UNB ID and password then click "UNB's internal hosting solution" under the Upload heading. After you upload, you will receive a URL to email to the professor.
