How do I register for courses?

Please note that as a graduate student, you are not required to consult an academic advisor. If you wish to discuss your course-plan and obtain further instruction, please reach out to your supervisor (outlined below).

How can I change my status?

If you want to change from part-time to full-time or vice versa, complete this form and have your Advisor/Supervisor approve it and send it to the Graduate Office: https://www.unb.ca/gradstudies/ assets/pdfs/application for leave.pdf

What is the maximum number of courses I can take in a term?

If you are a part-time student, you can take 1-2 courses per term. If you are a full-time student, you can take 3-4 courses per term (4 is the maximum). It is possible to complete 5 courses per term, but this requires approval from your Advisor/Supervisor and the Associate Dean (Graduate Programs).

Can I take 2 courses in May-June and 2 courses in July-August and still qualify as part-time? The summer term runs from May to August. If you wish to take more than two courses during this timeframe, your status must be full-time.

How do I know which courses are offered and whether they're online or face-to-face?

Can I take the term off from my studies?

If you're a course-based student (not completing a thesis/report/project) then yes, you can take the term off. You cannot take three consecutive terms off without a leave of absence.

Do research-based students need to be registered every term?

Yes. If you're a project/report student you have to register in ED6996 every term. If you're a thesis student you have to register in ED6997 every term.

How do I know if a textbook is required?

First, check D2L and your UNB email to see if the instructor has provided a syllabus. If not, check the <u>UNB Bookstore</u>. Lastly, if you cannot find the information, please contact the instructor.

I want to make sure I'm in the right courses and on the right path to completion. Who can answer my questions?

The faculty member listed as your Academic Advisor/Supervisor in your official acceptance letter can help you with your course selection. Your Welcome email also contains your advisor's contact information.

When is graduation?

<u>May</u> if you're finishing your last course in the winter term and <u>October</u> if you're finishing your last course in the summer term. The specific dates can be found here: https://www.unb.ca/graduation/

When do I apply to graduate?

The form is available starting in January or July: https://www.unb.ca/graduation/
The deadlines are March 1 for May convocation and September 1 for October convocation. If you're attending convocation, you will also need to reserve your gown, hood, and tickets via the website.

What does GAU mean and what do I put for this?

GAU stands for "Graduate Academic Unit" and yours is Education.
