Supplemental Course Information 2019-2020

Law 5223 Tax Clinic Course (Prof. V. Urinov) (Winter Term)

This course provides students with opportunities to gain hands-on experience in Canadian taxation, while acquiring practical skills in such things as client communications and the use of specialized software. Students provide legal information on tax law and regulations such as compliance, benefits and credits. They assist low-income individuals who meet certain criteria to file their personal income tax returns and may support systemic advocacy and assistance on tax issues through research, writing and presentations.

Pre-requisite: Law 3143 Personal Taxation

Interested students must apply no later than 4:00 pm (AST) by Friday, July 19, 2019. To apply each student must submit their CV, a personal statement, of no more than one page, explaining why they would like to be chosen to participate in the course, and a UNB eServices generated law transcript. Regular Course Offerings (Supplemental Descriptions)

Law 4163 Law and Social Justice (Prof. B. Reentovich) (Winter Term)

The aim of the Course is to understand how to use the law as a practical tool to affect social change. The Course will examine how the law can be engaged at multiple entry points with a particular focus on Charter legislation. The Course will explore historical examples of social justice movements to understand what worked and what didn't; topics will focus on engaging the Courts to address perceived social justice concerns.
