## Requirements

- 1. The Travel Subsidy is provided to undergraduate and graduate track teams only and only to students currently enrolled in a part-time or full-time program
- 2. The Travel Subsidy is provided by team, regardless of number of members
- 3. One person on the team will submit the Travel Subsidy application
- 4. Must provide receipts. Reimbursement is up to the amounts above based on actual spending
- 5. Reimbursements will be divided by the number of team members and deposited into each individual's bank account
- 6. Please note that reimbursements may may be considered a taxable benefit
- 7. Payments can only be made electronically to Canadian bank account
- 8. Must complete a Travel Subsidy Reimbursement Form after Apex
- 9. Apex subsidy is only provided after any subsidies your university provides. Eg if your whole trip is covered by your university, you can't claim for the Apex Travel Subsidy

## Limitations

Lodging	Hotels, Airbnb, etc. Provide receipt. Eligible dates: Jan 24, 25, 26
Fuel	Based on direct route using Google Maps from home city. Only one vehicle reimbursed.
Meals	No food reimbursed. All meals provided Jan 25 and Jan 26. No alchohol is reimbursed.
Airfare	Direct flight from home city to Fredericton.
Incidentals	No incidentals are reimbursed.

#### **Applications**

Apply for the Travel Subsidy at the time you apply to compete in Apex. You will receive confirmation in December if your application is successful if you are invited to compete. You will be contacted after Apex to submit receipts.
