



Margot Roach Summer Internship in Physics Research

This summer internship in physics research is generously supported by Margot Roach, a former UNB undergraduate whose illustrious research career, culminating as Professor Emerita of Medical Biophysics and Medicine at Western University, was launched by a summer research placement. This internship is designed to provide three deserving students with a similar opportunity to work in a research setting in Physics at UNB, prior to starting their university degrees.

This internship is open to all students who attended high school full time during the current academic year. The internship is non-residential: interns will commute to the UNB Fredericton campus each day during the placement.

Program Requirements

The successful candidates will present a short report on their summer experience, summarizing the research activity and how it has helped to prepare them for the future, to the Department.
