The <u>GlobalChild Program of Research</u> is looking for UNB student volunteers to support the data analysis team of the <u>InspiRights</u> project.

The GlobalChild program is an international program based at the University of New Brunswick and focuses broadly on improving child health and child development through facilitating the implementation of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) around the world.

The InspiRights project is aimed at taking a global inventory of good practices that inspire and promote the fulfillment of children's rights. By assembling a global inventory of good practices, the project can provide governments, NGOs, and other stakeholders with a list of practices that have been successful in promoting different children's rights under the CRC. Such resources can help them model their own practices as part of their plans for promoting and fulfilling children's rights.

We are looking for students (ideally 4th year undergrad or grad students) who:

- Are studying in the field of social sciences;
- Are fluent in either Spanish, French or Arabic;
- Are familiar with research processes, including literature searches and synthesizing summaries based on multiple documents; and
- Are available to commit 2-3 hours per week to this project.

Student volunteers will be tasked with:

- Searching the net for documents relevant to the identified practices from Spanish, French, or Arabic-speaking countries;
- Identifying key documents related to those practices;
- Providing a written summary of the practice while adhering to a set of identified assessment criteria and presenting the supporting documents.

In return for your time and support of our program, you will receive:

- A certificate of volunteering for a research program; and
- A modest honorarium.
