## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants should hold an undergraduate honours degree in economics, or equivalent, with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (B, or upper second-class standing).
- All applicants are required to submit a complete application.
- International applicants must submit:
  - Statement of purpose
  - Official Graduate Record Exam (GRE) test scores (minimum quantitative score of 150)
- International applicants whose first language is not English must submit language scores that meet or exceed:
  - International English language testing system (IELTS) = band 7
  - TOEFL = 92/120
