The Department of History and Politics, University of New Brunswick Saint John, invites applications for a four-month position in History at the rank of Assistant Teaching Professor. The appointment will commence on January 01, 2025 and is subject to budgetary approval.

The successful candidate will teach two sections of Introduction to Indigenous Studies (INDG 1002) and two upper-level history courses: HIST 3301 Canadian History Before Confederation and HIST 4361 Atlantic Provinces 1497-1784. Candidates must have a minimum of a Master's degree in History and undergraduate teaching experience. Preference will be given to candidates with a Ph.D. in History.

Review of applications will commence on April 8th, 2024 and will continue until the position is filled. Letters of application must include a cover letter, current curriculum vitae, and evidence of teaching effectiveness, and names and contact information of three academic references. Only those candidates short-listed will be contacted for an interview.
