### DEPARTMENT OF ENGINEERING TENURE-TRACK ASSISTANT PROFESSOR

The Department of Engineering at the University of New Brunswick, Saint John campus, invites applications for a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor, starting July 1, 2026, or a mutually acceptable date thereafter. This position is subject to final budgetary approval.

The department offers a 2-year diploma program in Engineering Foundation with specializations in chemical, civil, electrical, mechanical, and software engineering. The department offers a 4-year degree program in environmental engineering that started in Fall 2023. Also, the department is looking at expanding its offerings through teaching graduate courses toward the Master of Engineering in systems engineering. Candidates for the position must have a Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering or closely related discipline, and clear evidence of strong research ability, as the successful candidate will be expected to establish an externally funded research program and be involved in supervision of graduate (MSc and PhD) students. UNB Saint John has a strong commitment to teaching so demonstrated excellence in teaching will be an asset. Preference will be given to candidates with background in manufacturing engineering who have obtained a P. Eng. or who are eligible to do so. Responsibilities include teaching, research (including graduate student supervision), and assisting in university academic service.

The salary range and fringe benefits for this position is defined in the Association of University of New Brunswick Teachers (AUNBT) 2025 - 2029 Collective Agreement.

A complete application package must include a cover letter (indicating the competition number, plus a statement of current citizenship), along with the applicant's curriculum vitae, a statement of research interests, a statement of teaching philosophy, and three reprints of recent publications.
