Reporting to their respective Arts First course instructor(s), each GSTA will generally be expected to attend lectures of the course(s) to which they are assigned, to deliver weekly skills labs with students, to work with the course instructor(s) and the Coordinator of Advising and First-Year Experience to promote student learning and engagement, to meet with and advise students, and to grade coursework. Each GSTA also will have opportunities to help deliver course content, to engage in personal and professional development, and to reflect on their own learning. Instructors will provide each GSTA with training, support, and access to relevant course materials. These positions are ideal for graduate students who are interested in teaching and other educator and/or mentorship positions.

Each position will cover one or two terms (Fall 2026 and/or Winter 2027), depending on applicant suitability and needs. The work of each position will total 143 hours per term.

These positions fall under the Collective Agreement negotiated by the Public Service Alliance of Canada (PSAC) Local 60550 and the University of New Brunswick on behalf of the Union of Graduate Student Workers (UGSW). UNB and PSAC are committed to employment equity.
