Receiving a Disclosure of Sexual Assault

Past Sexual Assault (more than 72 hours)

Listen to the individual and their needs.

Offer Support

Let them know you are there to listen. Don't pressure them to talk about the assault. Ask how you can help the most. Do not voice your own opinion or judgments.

Support and encourage their decisions.

Let them know you will be referring them to the Campus Sexual Assault Support Advocate (CSASA) for support. The individual can choose to refuse the support offered by the CSASA.

Ask the individual how you can best help them.
