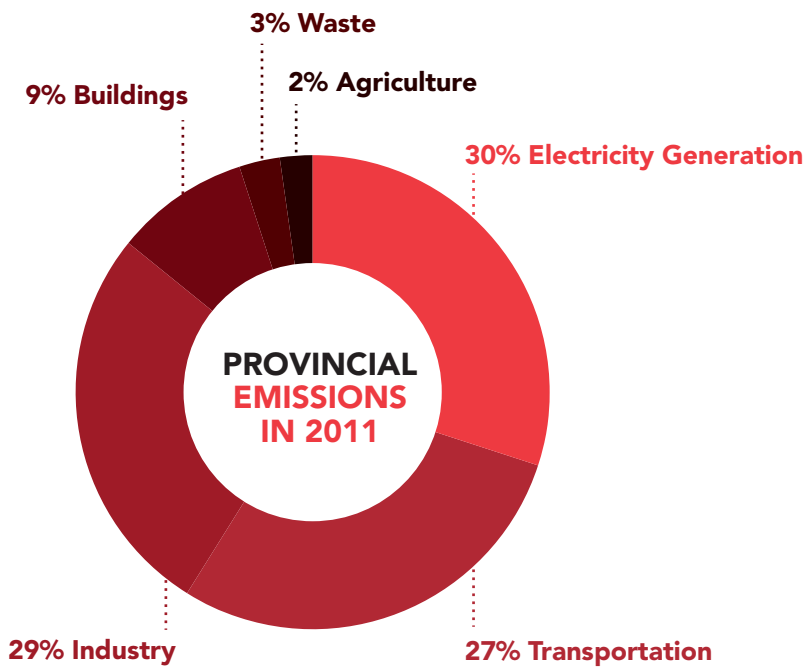


TAKE ACTION ON CLIMATE CHANGE!

The University of New Brunswick is creating a Climate Change Action Plan stating emission reduction targets for the Fredericton and Saint John campuses.



In 2009, UNB developed an emission reduction plan in support of a Presidents' Climate Change Statement. Although this statement did not materialize, UNB carried out the plan successfully, meeting the 2012 goals. UNB is now taking the next step by creating a Climate Change Action Plan to improve the institution by establishing targets and through creation of adaptation and mitigation strategies.

The creation of this plan is timely as the provincial and federal governments announce potential carbon taxes. The approximate cost of a UNB carbon tax could be as much as \$750,000 per year based on current operations. Therefore, the implementation of a Climate Change Action Plan will influence the campus socially, environmentally, and economically.
