POLICY RESEARCH AT UNB




If you want to change the world, here are the trenches where the real work is done.

Researchers throughout the University of New Brunswick (UNB) work tirelessly to provide the evidential understanding needed to affect change across many areas of social and public policy.

As stated by UNB President H.E.A. (Eddy) Campbell: "Our experts in fields such as healthcare, education, economics, aboriginal affairs and earth sciences gather knowledge from around the world and think hard about its relevance and impact here in New Brunswick. The lessons they learn, the evidence acquired and its subsequent analysis and application to informed decision making can be deployed anywhere around the globe. Our current ecosystem of public policy expertise is more vast, more relevant and has more impact than ever."

Policy research is perhaps one of the most pervasive research topics found within the university. Hundreds of researchers from practically all disciplines are either working directly on policy elements, or are exploring evidentiary data that supports policy decisions. Fueled by more open access to large health, social and economic datasets, UNB has invested in infrastructure to facilitate the linking of these and other diverse datasets for secure, deep-dive research and analysis, while retaining individual privacy. This enables the evidentiary evaluation of current policies, and a factual basis for improving or establishing new policies that can be directed at solving complex societal issues.
