

How to register for your courses

Below is the course list for the LPN Bridge Program. These courses are mandatory; however, you must still go online and register for them to select your schedule and complete your registration. Students cannot register for the noted NURS courses unless they are in the LPN Bridge Program.

ONLINE VERSIONS - If Psyc 1003, Biol 2831 and Stat 2263 are available at the UNB College of Extended Learning (CEL) then approval to take online courses may be obtained via the Program Coordinator. Please complete the [approval form](#) and forward it to the [Program Coordinator](#) before applying at [UNB CEL](#). Please note: LPN Bridge program deadlines take priority over UNB CEL course completion deadlines.

Steps for online registration

- Activate your MyUNB online account using your Student ID number and Login ID. These are included in your acceptance letter from the UNB Registrar's Office.
- At the MyUNB homepage, use the **Launch Menu** to choose **Select Courses**.
- Use the **Search and Select** option to find the mandatory courses listed above. If you do not find your courses – go back and check to ensure you have properly entered the correct term and campus.

***Note:** You do not have to fill in ALL of the search information. Like a search engine, Search and Select will list courses based on the information you input. The more information, the more specific the search results will be – but it does not require all the inputs to be completed in order to search. Often the SUBJECT and LEVEL will suffice. (For example: NURS / 1000 level)*

- Use the checkboxes to confirm your courses. **Submit** your selections.
- Use the drop-down boxes and **Register** for ALL courses you wish to finalize. Then **Submit** your selections.
